

MURANG' A COUNTY GOVERNMENT FINANCE ACT 2018

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THE MURANGA COUNTY FINANCE ACT 2018

A Bill for

An Act of County Assembly of Murang'a to provide for the Imposition or variation of various Taxes, Licenses, Rates, Rents, Fees and other service charges, and other revenue raising measures for services.

ENACTED by the County Assembly of Murang'a as follows-

PART 1 - PRELIMINARIES

Short title and commencement

1. The bill may be cited as the **Murang'a County Government Finance Act 2018** and shall come into operation, or be deemed to have come into operation on the date of publication in the Kenya gazette

Interpretations

2. In this bill unless it is stated otherwise;

“Agricultural rental rate” means a rate charged on agricultural land based on value or acreage;

“Authorized channel” means the method, mode or process of collection of County Revenue or making payment to the County as approved by the County Government;

“Business” means -

- a) trade, commerce; manufacture, profession, vocation or occupation;
- b) any other activity in the nature of trade, commerce or manufacture, profession, vocation or occupation;

- c) any activity carried on by a person continuously or regularly, whether or not for gain or profit and which involves, in part or in whole, the supply of goods or services for consideration;

“County government” means the County Government of Murang’a;

“County public officer” means a County Public Officer within the meaning of section 2 of the County Government Act, 2012;

“Executive member” means the County Executive Member for the time being responsible for Finance;

“License and Permit” means a document authorizing the use or to do a particular activity;

“County receiver of revenue” means persons appointed pursuant to section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;

“County revenue collector” means persons appointed pursuant to section 158 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;

“Advert” means any form of promotion and information boards, sign, shows, announcements;

“Building” a structure with a roof and walls such as a house, a school, a store or a factory constructed over a plot of land and which may have one or more levels;

“Canopy” a covering usually of fabrics supported on poles and held up over something;

“Cess” means a tax or a levy for any produce under the second schedule of this Bill;

“Corporate charge” means a charge that can be paid once or quarterly which covers generally all forms of advertisement;

“County Assembly” means the County Assembly of Murang’a;

“Dealer” means a person or business that buys and sells goods and or services;

“Fees and charges” means the fees and charges payable in respect of the provisions of this act to be determined from time to time by the county Government.

“Room” means a room constructed or adopted as a living or sleeping room.

“Hawk” means, whether as principal agent or employee – trade by the sale or exchange of goods, wares; Merchandise, refreshment’s, by moving along streets or public places or from Premises to premises;

“Hawker” means and includes any person who as principal, agent or employee carries on the business of offering or exposing goods for sale, barter or exchange by hawking and without placing them in any designated market place;

“Horticulture” that branch of agriculture concerned with growing of plants that are used by people for food, medicinal purposes and for aesthetic gratification and includes fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, nursery crops and floricultural crops;

“Impound” seize and take legal custody of a property of another person including a vehicle, goods, items, commodities or Document as a consequent of an infringement of a law or regulation and includes locking up a domestic animal or animals in a compound or enclosure;

“Market” a place where agricultural and livestock items are processed or otherwise exchanged for monetary gain;

“Nganangu” means kikuyu basket handles;

“Njugu” means kikuyu peas;

“Parking” means an act of stopping a vehicle at a parking lot or any other area in a town whether designated or not; it also means an area designated for stopping vehicles at any town and surrounding area within the county jurisdiction and includes at private property;

“PSV” means public service vehicles pursuant to Section 100 of the Traffic Act Cap 403 Laws of Kenya;

“Quarry” means a place from which dimension stones, rocks, construction aggregates, sand, gravel, murram and other building and construction materials are excavated from the ground;

“Rental House” means all rental private, public, residential and commercial houses within the area of jurisdiction of Murang’a County Government;

“Rural” means all other areas within the jurisdiction of Murang’a County Government not classified as urban areas under part 11 clauses 4 of this Bill;

“Shop” means a building or part of a building where goods or services or both are sold or stored;

“Traffic” means the movement of motor vehicles, motorcycles, bicycles; handcarts, animal carts; tractors; persons’ or any other machine or object capable of being moved in an area along a street, lane, road, air or over a water route within the area of jurisdiction of Murang’a County Government;

“Workshop” means a place where commodities are manufactured or repaired;

General terms

Currency –The charges/amount shown in the in the current charges and new charge column are in Kenyan Shilling

Receipts – A county receipt must be issued/obtained for all payment of taxes, fee and charges and includes online receipt where electronic payment mode is used and all receipt must bear the county name; logo; amount paid; time of payment and office or department to which the charges, fee or taxes are made.

Urban areas- In the context of this Finance bill, an urban area specifically means Murang’a, Kenol, Kangari, Kiria-ini Kiruara Maragua and Kangema Towns.

PART II- FEES, CHARGES, LICENCES, PERMITS, RATES RENT

Advertisement, promotions, information boards

3. (1) All form of advertisement, promotion, information boards, and signage shall be charged the amount set out in the New charge column of the first schedule of this Bill.

(2) The charges shall be paid before the commencement of the advert that run for a period of one year or less and for adverts that run for more than one year, payment shall fall due on 1st day of January every consequent year.

(3) Any person, body or organization that puts up an advert without duly paying the requisite fee shall be deemed to have committed an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Five Hundred Thousand, or three months imprisonment or both.

(4) The County Government, without prejudice to paragraph (3) above may remove, deface, hold, and or pull down any advert where the requisite charges are not paid for.

(5) The County Government may enter into an agreement upon approval by the Executive Member for payment of corporate charge for advertisement and promotions

Agriculture, agriculture produce/mining cess, fisheries and markets

4. (1) All Agricultural services and market fees shall be charged as set out in the new charge column of the second schedule.

(2) National government laws relating to movement of stock, vaccinations, slaughter house operations and inspection shall continue to apply.

(3) (a) All farms and factories where produce cess is imposed shall be required to keep records of all their produce.

(b) Failure by a farm, a factories or a processors of agricultural produce to keep records will attract charges that shall be imposed by the County Government based on turnover, whether it includes value addition or not, or estimate production per acre whichever is higher.

(c) The assessment as set out in paragraph (b) above shall be the basis of calculating the cess payable until the firm as above stated provides true records.

(d) Any person or corporate body that contravenes subsection (3) (a) above shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya shillings Ten Thousand or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month or both.

(4) Any person, or corporate body operating in a market shall operate under the rules as shall be set by the County Government from time to time and shall carry out the operation in a manner that allows other persons to benefit from designated markets areas.

(5) No person will sublet, allocate or carry any other business in any market place apart from those approved by the County Government.

(6) All livestock and goods brought to the markets shall be deemed to be free from diseases and contamination and it is the responsibility of the vendor to take due diligent and care to ensure compliance with this requirement.

(7) Any vendor who by omission or commission contravenes subsections(4), (5) and (6) above shall be guilty of an offense and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Thirty Thousand) or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two months, or to both.

(8) Any person who contravenes subsections (4), (5), and (6) above shall notwithstanding the penalties above be barred from carrying on business in the markets for a period not exceeding one month.

Manure, Timber, Mining, Quarry, Building materials: licences fees and transport cess

5. (1) All Agricultural services and market fees shall be charged as set out in the new charge column of the third schedule.

(2) All transporters of materials extracted, harvested or produced within the jurisdiction of the County Government shall be required to pay cess and charges at the cess paying point that is nearest to the area of production.

(3) All transporters who may have obtained their produce in another county but who fails to produce proof in the form of receipts of such payment to the county of origin shall be deemed to have obtained the produce from areas within the jurisdiction of this county and shall consequently be required to pay the charges as would have otherwise been charged by the County Government.

(4) Where receipts are produced as proof subject to subsection (10) above, the same shall only be valid for one trip and shall be deemed to be valid only if it was issued within twenty four hours of such production.

(5) Transporters of produce from other counties shall be required to submit proof of payment from the county of origin to the revenue clerk at the cess point nearest to the point of entry to the county and upon such production the clerk shall stamp/endorse the receipt and indicate the time when the receipt was produced.

(6) All transportation activities shall be carried out between 0630 hour and 1800hour, unless express permission is obtained from the receiver of revenue and which shall be for a specified period.

(7) The county government officers may stop any transporter at any place within the county to confirm payment.

(8) The driver of the transport vehicle shall be personally responsible for payment of the cess fee and the County Government shall have the powers to impound a vehicle where the owner or the driver fails to pay the requisite fee or where the owner or the driver is in breach of any regulation until such time the stated fees and penalties are paid.

(9) Any owner or driver of a vehicle who is in breach of the regulations as set out in sub section (8) above shall apart from being required to pay the applicable fee shall also pay the impounding and holding fee as set out in the eighth **schedule** of Bill.

(10) Further and without prejudice to subsection (9) above the driver of the lorry shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Thirty Thousand or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two months, or both.

Public health

6. (1) All public health services shall be charged as set out in the charge column of the fourth schedule.

(2) The Public health act cap 242 of the laws of Kenya shall however continue to apply to the county on public health management and shall be enforced by the County Government.

(3) Any person who fails to pay the charges as laid down or to comply with public health laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Fifty Thousand or imprisonment not exceeding one month or both

(4) The public health officer shall before taking any action against such person be required to give a notice of not more than twenty one days to the that person to comply with the requirements.

Weights and measurers

7. (1) All public weights and measures charges shall be charged in line with the fees set out in the new charge column of the forth schedule.

(2) Weights and measures act cap 513 laws relating to inspection of weigh machines, weight, calibration, weighted goods, and volumes shall continue to apply and shall be enforced by the county government where applicable.

(3) Any person who fails to pay the set charges or to comply with weights and measures laws shall;

(a) be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Fifty Thousand or to an imprisonment for a period not exceeding three month or both,

(b) Pay the charges as set out in the new charge column of the third schedule.

Land, housing, physical planning fees

7. (1) All land property rates/rent, development fees and house rent shall be charged according to the fees set out in the new charge column of the fifth schedule.

(2) Article 209 (3) of the 2010 Constitution of Kenya gives the county government the authority to levy property rates to meet its liabilities that are not covered by the exchequer and other fees and charges.

(3) The county government shall apply a form of flat rates when charging;

(a) an agricultural rental rate.

(b) a graduated rate according to the area of the land.

(c) a differential flat rate or a differential graduated rate for an area of land according to the use to which the land is put or capable of being put, or for which it is reserved

(d). an industrial rate upon area of land used for industries or factories

(4) a site value rate shall apply where;

(a) A valuation roll is in existence,

(b) Land rates become due and payable on 1st day of January and any amount that remains outstanding after 31st March shall be charged an interest/penalty of 2% per month.

(c) Any rates remain outstanding for more than six months the county government can take measures deemed appropriate to enforce payment of such rates including but not limited to obstructing the quiet enjoyment of the property, closure of any structure or premises within the property, arrest of occupants and or taking possession of items within the property.

(d) The rates due for a period of more than two years the county government may repossess or take ownership of the property, and auction the property to recover the outstanding amount.

(e) Any amount in excess after the sale under subparagraph (iv) above and all costs incidental thereto are deducted the said amount shall be paid to the owner of the property within 21 days

(5) Any act of subdivision or amalgamation of a property shall only be carried out after approval by the county officer in charge of physical planning and after payment of the applicable fee as set out in the fifth schedule.

(6) Any property sub-division or amalgamation and or purported title granted in contravention with section (5) shall be deemed to be null and void.

(7) Any state officer whether employed by the county or national government who abets in the above offence shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Two Hundred Thousand or imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or both.

(8) All developments, building, holding, improvements, shall first be approved by the county development board prior to commencement and after paying all the requisite fees as set out in the fifth schedule.

Illegal buildings

(9) Any development carried out without the approval of the development board and payment of related charges or that which is not inspected as set out in the inspection plans shall be deemed to be illegal.

(10) The county government may take any appropriate action under this act or any other law including but not limited to, stopping further development, impounding construction materials, demolishing the development, and arresting the owner or the workers at site.

(11) Any person carrying out development in contravention of subsection (9) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Two Hundred Thousand or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or both.

(12) Persons liable under subsection (9) shall include the foreman, engineer, supervisors, and the owner of the property.

Approved plans and payment receipts

(13) every property owner or developer shall at all times during the development of any property keep and make accessible the approved development/building plans and all copies of receipts of payments made during the development process.

(14) Failure by the owner or developer to provide the documents under subsection (13) above shall be construed as not having the approved plans and the owner or developer shall be liable under subsection (11) shall apply.

Change of use

(15) Anyone who wishes to change the use of land shall apply to the county by paying the fees under the new charge column in the schedule

(16) The applicant shall also put an advert at his or her own cost in one of the national daily newspaper of his or her application for change of use

(17) On approval the applicant will be required to submit a valuation of the land from a professional land valuer both unimproved and improved value for the same to be included in the valuation roll and will form the basis of charging rates

Way leaves;

(18) All way leaves requests must be approved by the infrastructure department and the requisite payments made before commencement of any works

(19) The infrastructure department shall consequently outline the terms under which the works should be carried out.

(20) Subsection (11) shall apply for noncompliance with the terms of the way leave and payments thereto

Rental houses

(21) Payment for rental houses, stall, and any other county rental premises shall fall due on the 1st day of every month and must be paid within seven days from that day.

(22) Failure to pay the amount due in time will attract a penalty of 5% of the amount payable per month

(23) where payment of rent for any house or stall or any other premises remains outstanding for a period of three months the county government shall evict the tenant and take any action necessary to recover the debt including but not limited to holding items in lieu of payment and subsequent auctioning of such items.

(24) any tenant who alters a building, erects additional structures or uses the premises for other purposes other than those stipulated in the tenancy agreement commits an offence.

Finance and economic development

9. (1) all sales of documents and charges relating to finance and economic planning shall be charged as set out in the new charge column of the sixth schedule.

Cooperative society audit and registration

(2) All registration of cooperatives shall be carried out by the county government and a certificate issued.

(3) Cooperative societies within the county must be audited once every year and pay a fee equivalent to the work done but not less than the fees set out in the schedule.

(4) Any cooperative society within the county that fails to submit its account to the county cooperative audit office shall be guilty of an offence and the society and /or the executive members shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred thousand or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months

(5) The cooperative officer may authorize any registered firm of accountants to carry out audit on its behalf and such firm shall be required to pay to the county not less than 15% of their fees note.

(6) Failure by the firm to pay the amount under subsection (3) shall render it liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings two hundred and fifty thousand.

- (7) All other social organization that can be registered including but not limited social and welfare groups may apply for registration at the County Government and renewal of registration every year
- (8) The County Government will not recognize any organizations from the county that is not so registered

Traffic and parking;

10. (1) All traffic and parking shall be charged according to the fees set out in the new charge column of the seventh schedule.

Public Service Vehicles and Public Service Motor bicycles operations

- (2) The traffic act cap 403 shall continue to apply and shall be enforced by the county government on traffic matters on areas under the county jurisdiction
- (3) Restriction on picking and dropping of passengers around towns and away from bus stops apply to all towns where Public Service Vehicles have a designated parking area and or a bus stop and such restrictions apply the same extends to a distance of not more than two kilometers from the designated parking area.
- (4) all public service vehicles and public service motorcycle SACCOs shall be required;
- (a) to maintain discipline and order.
 - (b) to develop internal regulation which shall be enforced by the SACCO and the county government jointly.
- (5) to work with counties in ensuring that payments due to the county are made by its members.
- (6) In case of default by the SACCO to comply with subsection(4), the County Government may take any necessary action against the SACCO and the members including barring the SACCO and or the individual operator from plying in the county for a specified period of time which shall nevertheless not exceed one year.

Parking fees

(7) every vehicle parked within the county whether at a designated parking bay or not, including vehicles parked at road reserves, around commercial and residential buildings, at all towns and areas near towns where commercial activities takes place whether at a public area or a private property shall be required to pay parking fee.

(8) The county shall at any given time give directions and regulations regarding parking of vehicles.

(9) The county government in enforcing payment of parking fees may;

(a) clamp the vehicle.

(b) tow the vehicle to county offices nearby or police yard, or

(c) block the vehicle.

(10) a vehicle that has been clamped, towed or blocked shall only be released upon payment of the parking fee in default plus clamping fee, towing fee and holding fee whichever is applicable.

(11) Further and without prejudice to subsection (10) above the driver of the vehicle will be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya shillings Twenty Thousand or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

Alcoholic license

11. (1) All trading and alcoholic license shall be charged as set out in the third and fourth column of the ninth schedule according to the respective zone

(2) The county alcohol control act shall apply to all matters regarding the approval and control of alcoholic drinks in the county.

(3) Alcoholic license shall be valid for that calendar year and shall be renewable annually

Trading license

11. (1) All persons carrying out all trading activities except alcohol trade shall be required to apply and pay for trading license before the commencement of trading activity as per the charges set out in the fifth and sixth column of the tenth schedule

(2) Such license shall be valid for that calendar year and shall be renewable annually on or before the 31st day of March every subsequent year.

(3) Failure to renewal within the stipulated time shall attract an interest of 25% on the value of permit in April and 3% per month in the subsequent months.

(4) All other charges relating to the business including where applicable but not limited to conservancy fees, garbage collection fees, plot rates and rent, public health fees shall be paid prior to payment of the trading license fees.

(5) All laws of public health, safety and any other law or regulation pertaining to the business must be adhered to and granting of trading license does not exempt such person from the responsibilities under those laws and regulations

(7) a person who contravenes the requirements above shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to pay the full amount due to the county, penalty and a fine not exceeding Kenya shillings Five hundred thousand or imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month provided that such failure is not due to unavailability of funds.

(8) the county may charge impound items from the business and charge holding fee impounding fees and compliance charges

Multiple businesses in one premise

(9) where more than two businesses are operating in one premise, the County Government shall charge the license with the highest fee as categorized in the fee Schedule.” provided the businesses are not run separately.

Exemption of trading license for persons with disabilities

(10) For purposes of this Act, pursuant to article 56(b) of the constitution of Kenya, a person with disability (PWDs) may apply through the ward administrator or Sub County Administrator for approval of any exemption of trading license by the CEC member in charge of Finance on individual basis.

Firefighting fees and charges

12.(1) All charges for fire and safety shall be charged according to the fees set out in the fourth column of the eleventh schedule.

(2) The county government shall enforce the national safety act in all places including but not limited to commercial places, schools and residential houses.

(3) Any person who contravenes subsection (1) and (2) above shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Twenty Thousand or an imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month.

Executive member authority

13.(1) The executive member may by order in the Kenya gazette amend any of the schedules set out in this act.

(2) Any amendment under subsection (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without unreasonable delay, and unless the amendment is passed by the County Assembly within 21 days after

tabling before the County Assembly, the order shall lapse, but without prejudice to anything previously done thereunder

(3) Any waiver granted by the national government affecting the county must be done in consultation and concurrence with the Executive Member or through the laid down inter-governmental structures.

(4) The executive member shall have the powers to revoke such waiver and demand full payment for the respective fees and charges waived if in his own judgment the waiver is unjustifiable.

PART 111 – PAYMENTS

Receiver and collector of revenue

14. (1) The executive member shall appoint any person as receiver and collector of revenue in accordance to section 157 and 158 of the public finance management act.

(2) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the County Government unless he or she has been appointed to do so and therefore have the authority as receiver or collector of revenue.

(3) Any county public officer other than the receiver or collector of revenue who collects fees, charges, permit, rent, or any other such fee as may be imposed by the county government from time to time shall NOT later than three days after receiving it deliver the revenue to county receiver of revenue or collector of revenue

Payments

15.(1) All payments to the county government shall be paid through an authorized channel.

(2) A county receipt shall be issued for all payments made under this act.

(3) County receiver or collector of revenue, enforcement officer, auditor and any other authorized officer may require production of receipt from the customers or members of the public as proof of payments made under this act.

(4) Any person who contravenes section (14) will be guilty of an offence and be liable to pay a fine of not less than Kenya shillings twenty thousand or imprisonment of one month or both

PART 1V – OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

General offences and penalties

16. (1) Any person who obstructs any County Authorized Officer in the cause of his or her official duties shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Any person who damages or destroys council property, documents or other item used for revenue collection or enforcement shall be guilty of an offence.

(3) Any person who knowingly provides the county with wrong information in order to subvert the payments under this act shall be guilty of an offence.

(4) Any person who collects revenue with receipt books not issued by the county government shall be guilty of an offence.

(5) Any person who commit the above offences and any other offence under this bill for which no penalty is provided for shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya shillings Fifty Thousand, or to imprisonment for a period of not more than two months, or both.

Offences by county staff

17. any staff of the county government or any other person to whom a duty to perform has been conferred under this act;

(1) Makes in any record or document which he/she is required to keep or make an entry which they know or have reasonable cause to believe to be false or not true;

(2) Willfully refuses or neglects to do anything under this act which they know is required to be done by them;

(3) interferes with another person or obstruct any other staff from carrying out his/her duties;

(4) Willfully contravenes the provisions of this bill to give undue advantage to another person;

(5) Give waiver or exemption to any person from paying the amount due

Shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Kenya Shillings Two Hundred Thousand and or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six month, or both.

(6) The conviction provided above shall apply notwithstanding further actions under the public service act.

PART V – MISCELLANEOUS

Transition

18. (1) any person who before the commencement of this act was a holder of a valid license or permit issued under the previous legislations in force shall continue to hold such license until the stipulated time expires.

(2) All directives, resolutions, orders and authorization on or relating to financial management, including collection and administration of fees and charges given or issued by the defunct county council of Murang'a before the commencement of this bill and which have not been changed by this bill shall be deemed to have been given, issued or made under the authority of the county assembly and shall continue to be in force until those directives resolutions orders and authorizations are repealed or new laws or regulations made

(3) All valuation rolls, valuation of property carried out by the defunct Municipal council of Murang'a, County council of Maragua and Town council of Makuyu shall continue to be applied until new valuation rolls are prepared by the county government.

Cessation

19. Unless provided in this act, the fees, charges, rates, licenses cess or rent applicable before the commencement of this act in respect of any business, activity, goods or services listed in the schedule shall cease to apply

Regulation

20. (1)The executive member may make regulation not inconsistent with this act respecting any matter that is necessary or convenient to be prescribed under this act or for carrying out and giving effect to this act.

(2) Regulations under subsection (1) shall not take effect unless approve by a resolution passed by County Assembly

(3) Regulations approved under subsection (2) shall take effect on the day after the day when the County Assembly approved them or the day set out in the regulations

(4) If the County Assembly does not make a resolution either approving or rejecting any regulation within 21 days after submission for approval, the assembly will have been deemed to have approved those regulations.

Court fines

21. The county government shall be entitled to 50% of the fines charged by the courts under this act or any other act prosecuted by the county.
