Mapping CSOs and Local Initiatives <i>Objective: Make civil society and local food initiatives visible, learnable, and policy-relevant.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Conduct a countywide mapping of CSOs, CBOs, cooperatives, and informal food initiatives across the food system• Develop a standardized registry capturing mandate, geography, target groups, and activities• Partner with local universities and research institutions to validate and analyze mapped initiatives• Integrate CSO and community data into CSPMU planning and reporting processes• Establish a feedback loop where mapped initiatives inform policy design and resource allocation

Multisectoral Food Information Systems <i>Objective: Enable evidence-based food policy and accountability through integrated data systems.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Define a core set of food systems indicators spanning agriculture, health, nutrition, water, markets, and social protection• Integrate existing sectoral datasets into a unified county food systems dashboard under CSPMU• Enable data contributions from civil society, cooperatives, and research partners• Establish data governance protocols for quality, access, privacy, and use• Build capacity of county officers and partners to use food systems data for planning and monitoring

Participatory Education and Research <i>Objective: Strengthen local capacity, equity, and innovation through co-produced knowledge.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Establish participatory research programmes linking farmers, communities, and universities• Support farmer-led trials and demonstration plots under agroecology programmes• Integrate rights-based and food systems learning into extension and youth programmes• Document and scale successful local innovations through training and policy briefs• Align research agendas with county food systems priorities and equity objectives

Food Flow Assessments</p> <p><i>Objective: Understand how food moves to, within, and out of the county to improve access and resilience.</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Map major food supply routes, volumes, and actors serving urban and peri-urban areas • Identify gaps in access to fresh and affordable food in underserved neighborhoods • Analyze transport, storage, and logistics constraints affecting food availability • Integrate food flow data into spatial planning and infrastructure investment decisions • Use findings to strengthen short food chains and urban–rural market linkages
