Cross-County Coordination and Rights-Based Food Governance <i>Objective:</i> Deliver food systems governance through a rights-based, whole-of-government approach.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Embed the Right to Food Policy across all relevant county departments• Use DAMIPEL and CSPMU as the central coordination mechanism for food systems actions• Align sectoral plans and budgets to food systems outcomes and rights-based indicators• Establish clear roles, responsibilities, and accountability lines across departments• Monitor compliance with rights-based principles at ward, sub-county, and county levels
02. Stakeholder Participation and Food Councils <i>Objective:</i> Institutionalize inclusive participation in food systems governance.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Strengthen and formalize CASSCOM as the county food policy coordination platform• Operationalize multi-stakeholder platforms at sub-county, ward, and village levels• Facilitate regular dialogue between County Executive, County Assembly, and food system actors• Conduct public awareness and education forums on food rights and policy priorities• Document and track stakeholder inputs and policy responses
04. Food Policy Development and Harmonization <i>Objective:</i> Ensure coherent, adequately resourced food policies across sectors and territories.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Review and map all county food-related policies, laws, and strategies to identify overlaps, gaps, and conflicts• Align agroecology, nutrition, health, trade, water, and climate policies under a single food-systems framework• Integrate urban, peri-urban, and rural food priorities into county planning and budgeting cycles• Establish a periodic food policy review mechanism linked to CASSCOM and County Assembly committees• Build policy implementation capacity through targeted training of county officers

06. Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilience <i>Objective: Strengthen food system resilience to climate shocks and crises.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Integrate food systems into county disaster risk reduction strategies • Establish early warning and rapid response mechanisms for food insecurity • Align emergency funds and contingency planning with food access priorities • Involve food system actors and CASSCOM in disaster preparedness planning • Build climate-resilient production and storage infrastructure
10. Standards for Public Facilities <i>Objective: Ensure safe, sustainable diets and water access in public institutions.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review and update food and nutrition standards for schools, hospitals, and public facilities • Enforce food safety and hygiene regulations through public health departments • Integrate sustainable diet standards into public catering and procurement contracts • Ensure reliable access to safe drinking water and sanitation in all public facilities • Monitor compliance through routine inspections and reporting
13. Universal Water and Sanitation <i>Objective: Achieve safe water and sanitation access as a foundation for nutrition and health.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Map water access and sanitation gaps across wards and vulnerable communities • Prioritize investment in boreholes, piped water, and small-scale irrigation systems • Expand WASH programmes in schools, ECDE centers, markets, and health facilities • Engage civil society and community groups in water management and maintenance • Monitor water quality and sanitation indicators as part of food and nutrition reporting
22. Ecosystem-Based Land Use <i>Objective: Guide land use planning using holistic, ecosystem-based approaches.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Map agricultural, ecological, and settlement zones using GIS and ecosystem criteria • Integrate agroecology and biodiversity objectives into spatial and land-use plans • Enforce wetland, riparian, and biodiversity protection regulations

Water Reuse in Agriculture</p> <p>Objective: Promote circular water use while protecting health and ecosystems.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop policies and guidelines for safe wastewater reuse in agriculture • Pilot grey-water and treated wastewater reuse projects with farmer groups • Train farmers and extension officers on safe reuse practices • Integrate water reuse into climate resilience and agroecology programmes • Monitor environmental and public health impacts of reuse initiatives

Food Control Systems</p> <p>Objective: Strengthen food safety, market access, and consumer protection.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review and harmonize county food safety legislation and enforcement procedures • Train food inspectors, market officials, and informal traders on food safety standards • Reduce regulatory barriers that exclude smallholder producers from markets • Integrate food safety, health, and environmental considerations in inspections • Establish transparent reporting and grievance mechanisms for food safety issues
